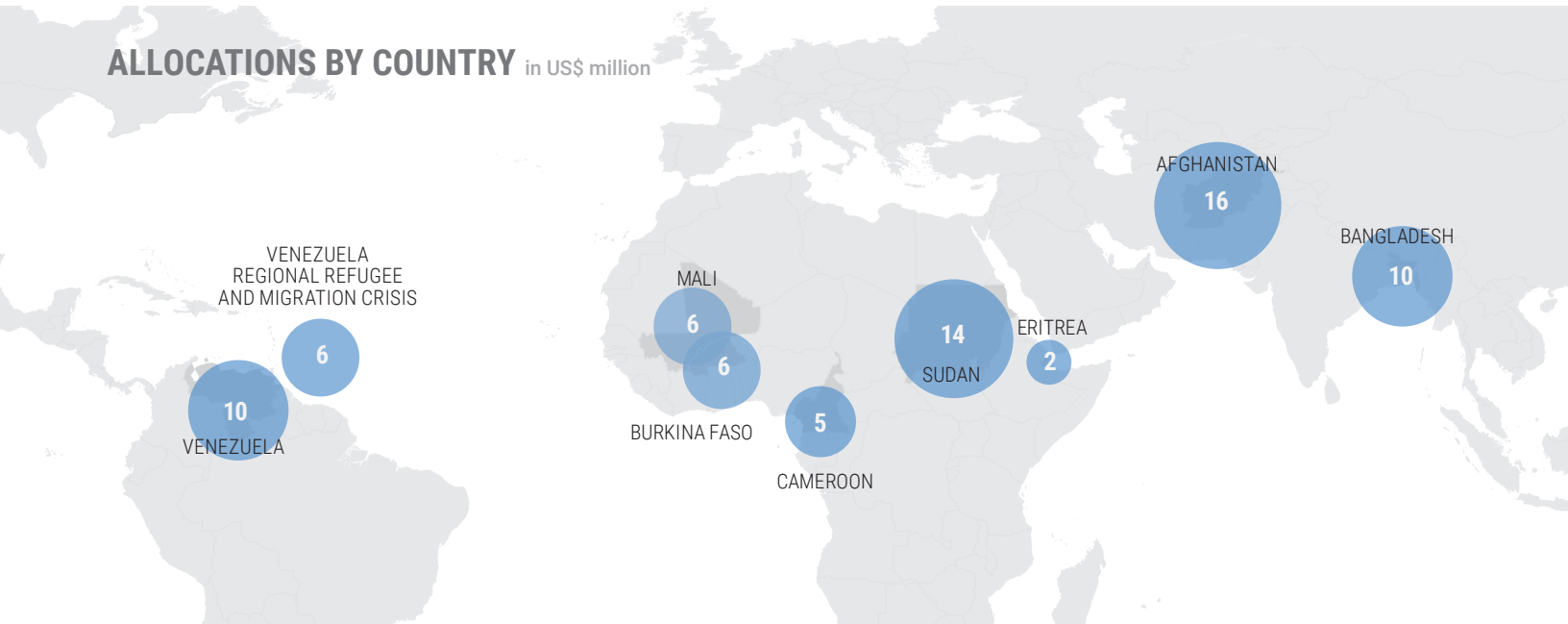

The Emergency Relief Coordinator has allocated \$75 million from the Central Emergency Response Fund (CERF) for the 2019 second Underfunded Emergencies round to assist some 4.2 million people in eight underfunded and/or protracted crises. The funds will help scale-up and sustain life-saving assistance in these emergencies where humanitarian suffering is alarmingly high while available resources are critically low. The CERF-funds will also systematically address four chronically underfunded areas of emergency response: (1) support for women and girls, including tackling gender-based violence, reproductive health and empowerment;

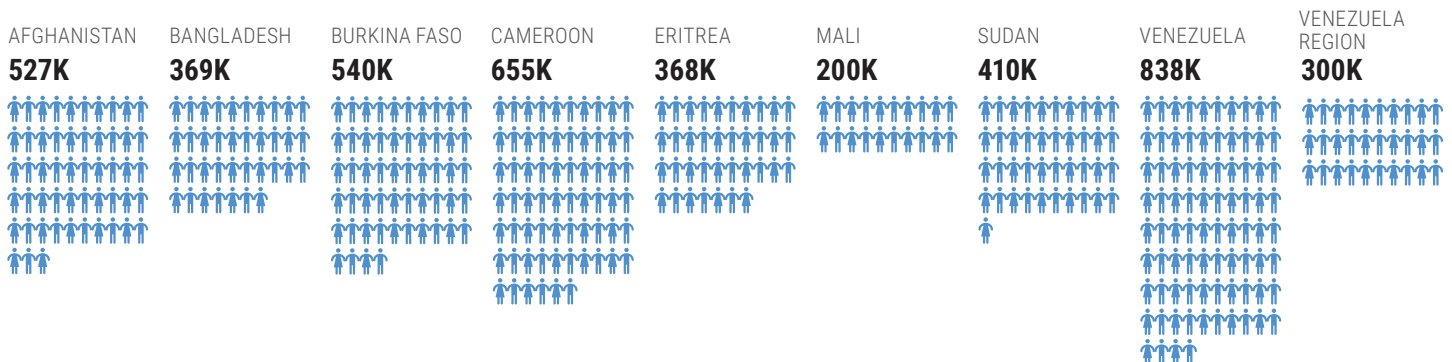
(2) programmes targeting disabled people; (3) education in protracted crises; and (4) other aspects of protection. This funding will target:

- People displaced/affected by conflict, natural disaster or ongoing crises in Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Mali, Sudan and Venezuela and the region.
- In Bangladesh, CERF will pilot multi-year education in emergencies programming for Rohingya refugee and host community children and youth.
- Drought response in Eritrea.
- Persisting food insecurity and malnutrition needs across Afghanistan, Mali and Sudan.
