2005/2006

15 DEC 2005
CERF established by UN General Assembly resolution 60/124

2006
CERF approval times are down from five to **three** days for rapid response and 11 to **six days** for underfunded emergencies (UFE)

2007

Approval time for UFE funding reduced to **five** days

DRC, Bangladesh and **Sudan** are top recipients of CERF funds (**\$104M** combined)

55 crises receive CERF funds in a single year—the most ever

2008

Haiti hurricane

CERF surpasses the **\$450M** funding target

14 JUL
\$100M from CERF for response to surging food prices reaching **17.8M** people in **26** countries

2009

Horn of Africa receives a third of CERF funds

Global recession dampens donor giving for the year

84 Member States and observers, the most ever, contribute funds in a single year

2010

Haiti earthquake

Funding approved in just 10 hours

In 2010
22M people receive food aid

19M people receive water and sanitation aid

19.5M children immunized

1.5M people receive emergency shelter

2011

Horn of Africa drought CERF allocates more than **\$128M** for response in Djibouti, Ethiopia, Kenya and Somalia

2012

Sahel drought CERF allocates more than **\$100M** for response

Syria regional crisis CERF allocates more than **\$50M**

In 2012
15.5M people receive water and sanitation aid

2013

Super Typhoon Haiyan hits the Philippines – CERF allocates **\$25.3M** within **48 hours**

In 2013, CERF ensures that **9.3M** people receive food aid

2014

Three L3 crises occur – CERF allocates **\$116M** for South Sudan regional response, **\$60M** for Central African Republic regional response, **\$26M** for Iraq response

2015

Syria regional crisis – CERF makes largest single allocation to date of **\$77M**

In 2015 and 2016

almost **70%** of CERF allocations are provided to operations in support of people displaced by crises in more than **40** countries

2016

El Niño – CERF allocates more than **\$118M** in **19 countries**

Reduction of CERF programme support costs from **3 to 2 per cent**

2017

Famine in Nigeria, Somalia, South Sudan and Yemen – CERF allocates **\$128M** to support critical early action

Rohingya refugees - CERF allocates **\$19M** to Bangladesh for humanitarian response

2018

Yemen Crisis – CERF allocates **\$50M** to address famine, collapse of public services and escalation in conflict

West Africa's Sahel – CERF allocates **\$30M** to address drought, high food prices and worsening food insecurity

2019

Cyclone relief in Southern Africa - CERF allocates **\$34.4M** to **4** countries affected by Cyclone Idai and Kenneth

CERF starts funding for **anticipatory action**

CERF piloted a **\$10M** two-year grant to Bangladesh through the Underfunded Emergencies window

2020

First ever **global pandemic allocation**: global block grants to UN agencies

First ever allocation to **frontline NGOs**: helped them deliver lifesaving health, water and sanitation

First ever **allocation** dedicated **entirely to fighting gender-based violence**

First ever allocation to fight rising food insecurity by funding **cash assistance in six countries**

2021

Conflict in Tigray, Ethiopia - CERF allocates **\$25M** to assist the worst affected communities and improved access for humanitarian operations

Afghanistan crisis - CERF allocates **\$93M** to the country team to scale up the humanitarian response, provide lifesaving health services and support the most underfunded operations.

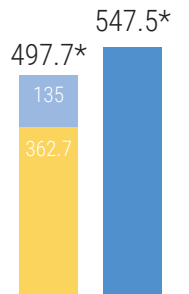
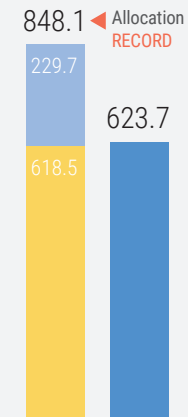
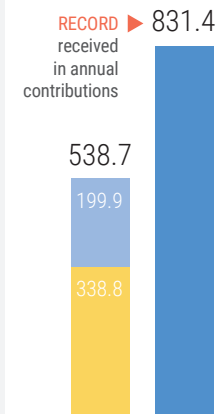
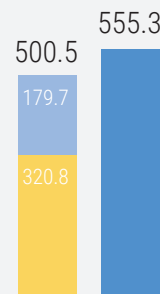
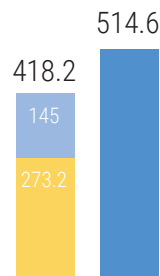
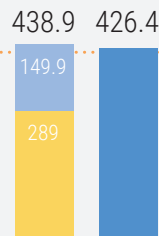
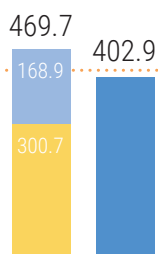
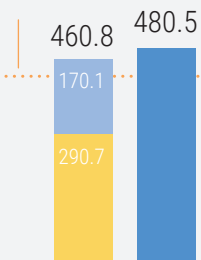
