
The Central Emergency Response Fund -CERF 2014

- The CERF is administered by OCHA and has more than 125 donor countries and 30 donors from private sector and civil society. The main donors are: United Kingdom, Sweden, Norway, the Netherlands, Germany, Canada, Denmark and Belgium among others. In 2014 CERF US\$ 460,799,180 for projects in 45 countries
- Countries such as South Sudan, Republic of Sudan, Ethiopia and Iraq continue to be the main recipients of resources representing 33.6% of global finance. In 2014, the CERF assigned to Colombia US\$ 4.505,91, which less than 1% of CERF funds.
- In 2014 the CERF has financed 11 humanitarian projects in Colombia. 60% of the funds was allocated to Protection and Food Security and Nutrition. Traditionally, the projects have been implemented in departments such as Chocó, Cauca, Nariño and Putumayo. By 2014, the Humanitarian Country Team decided to extend the geographical coverage, allocating resources to departments with gaps in humanitarian response such as Arauca, Caquetá, Meta and Guaviare. Chocó, Nariño and Arauca received 76% Colombia CERF funds.

By departments




FINANCING BY SECTOR




