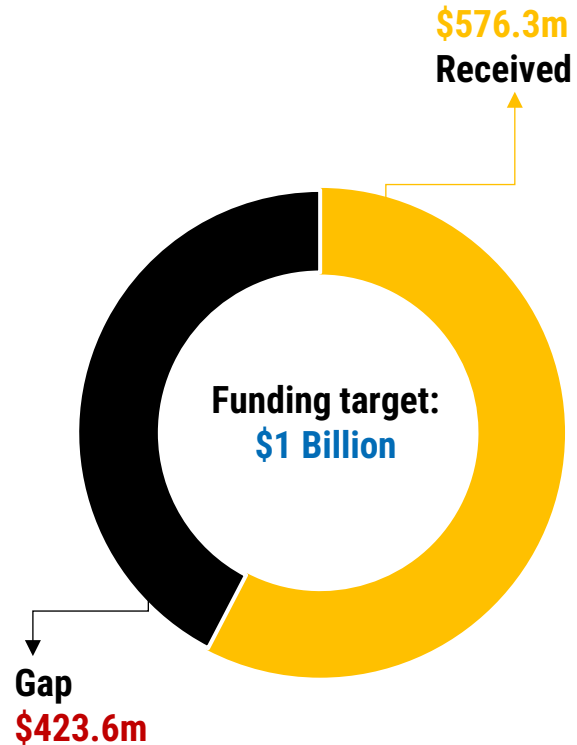

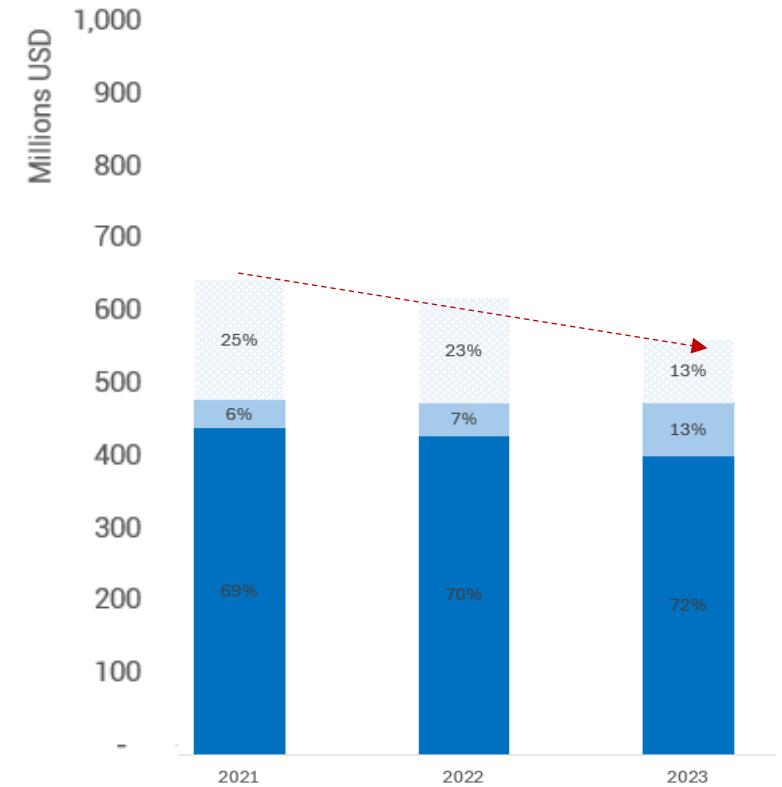

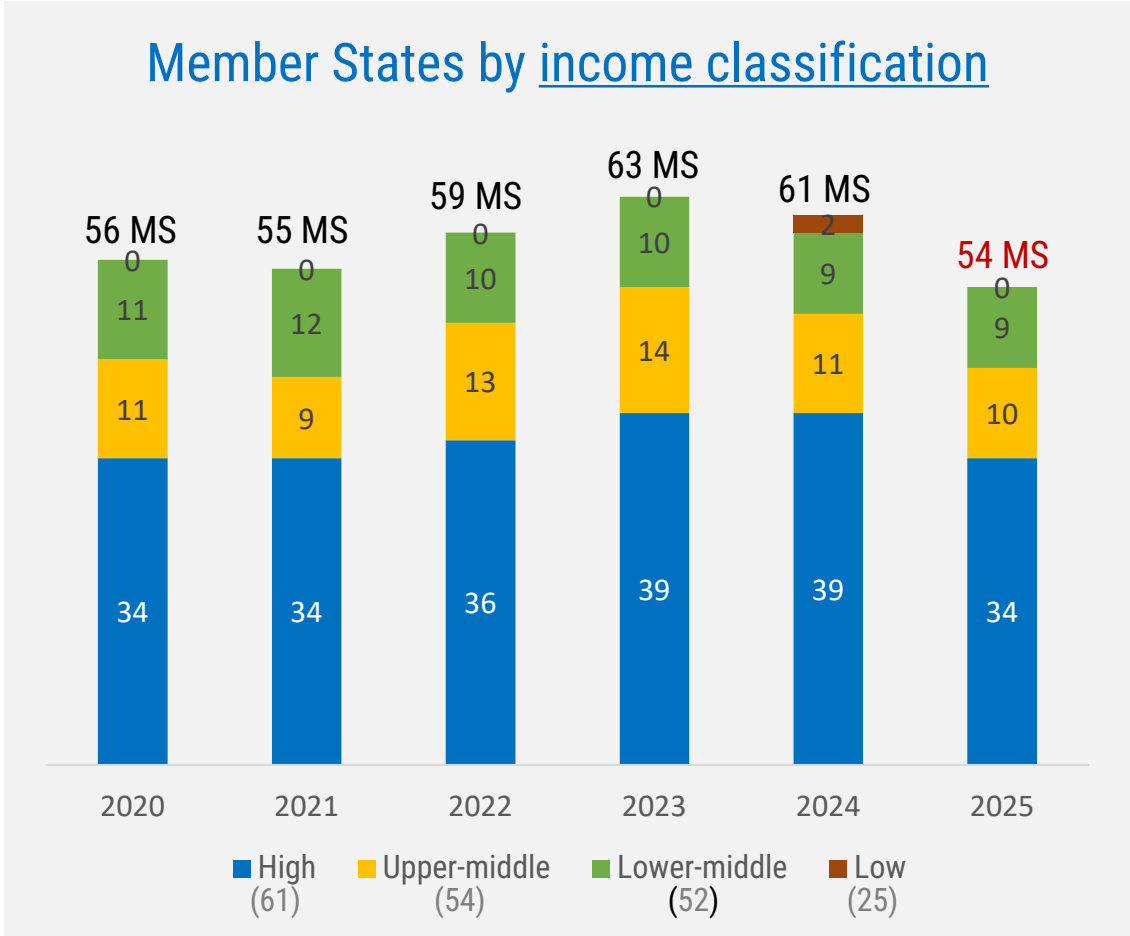
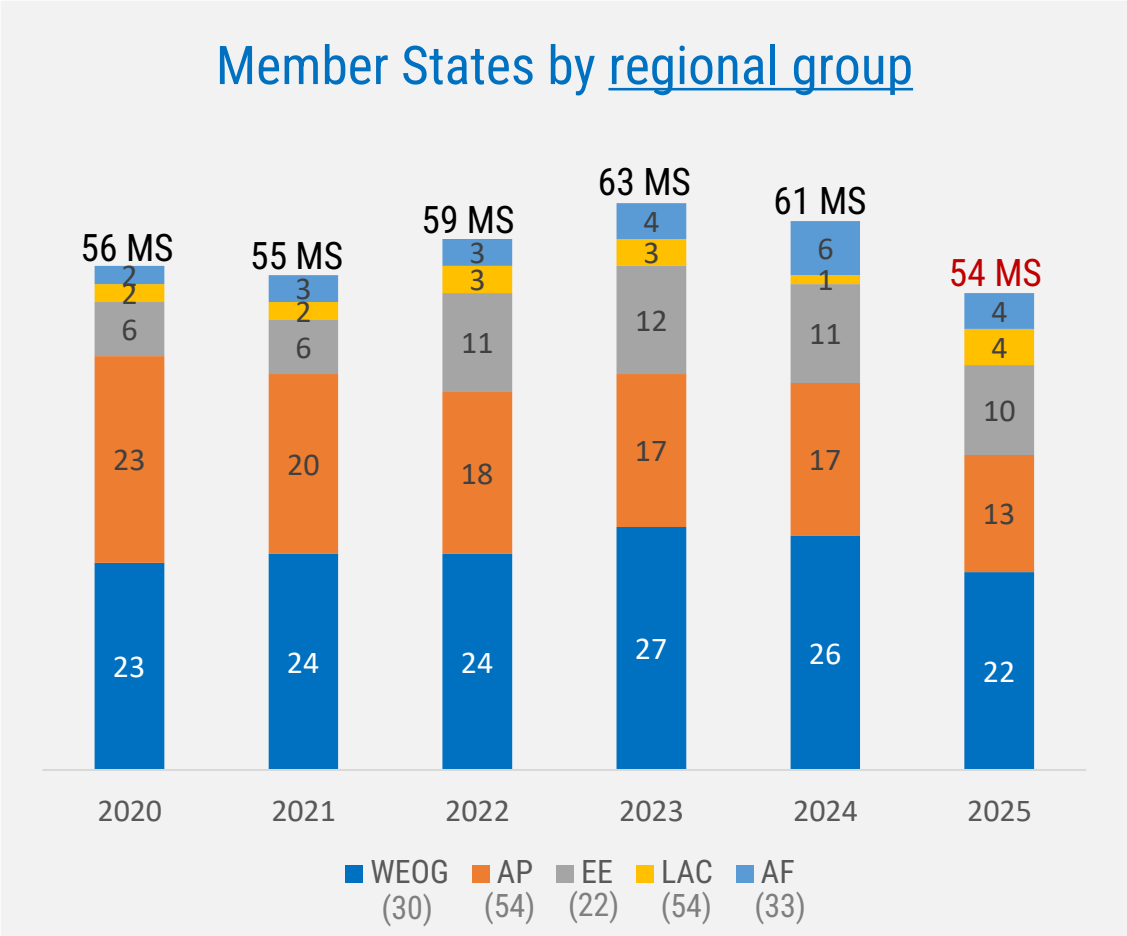
CERF Funding 2021-2023



■ Multi-year contributions ■ Single year contributions ■ Additional contributions (year-end)

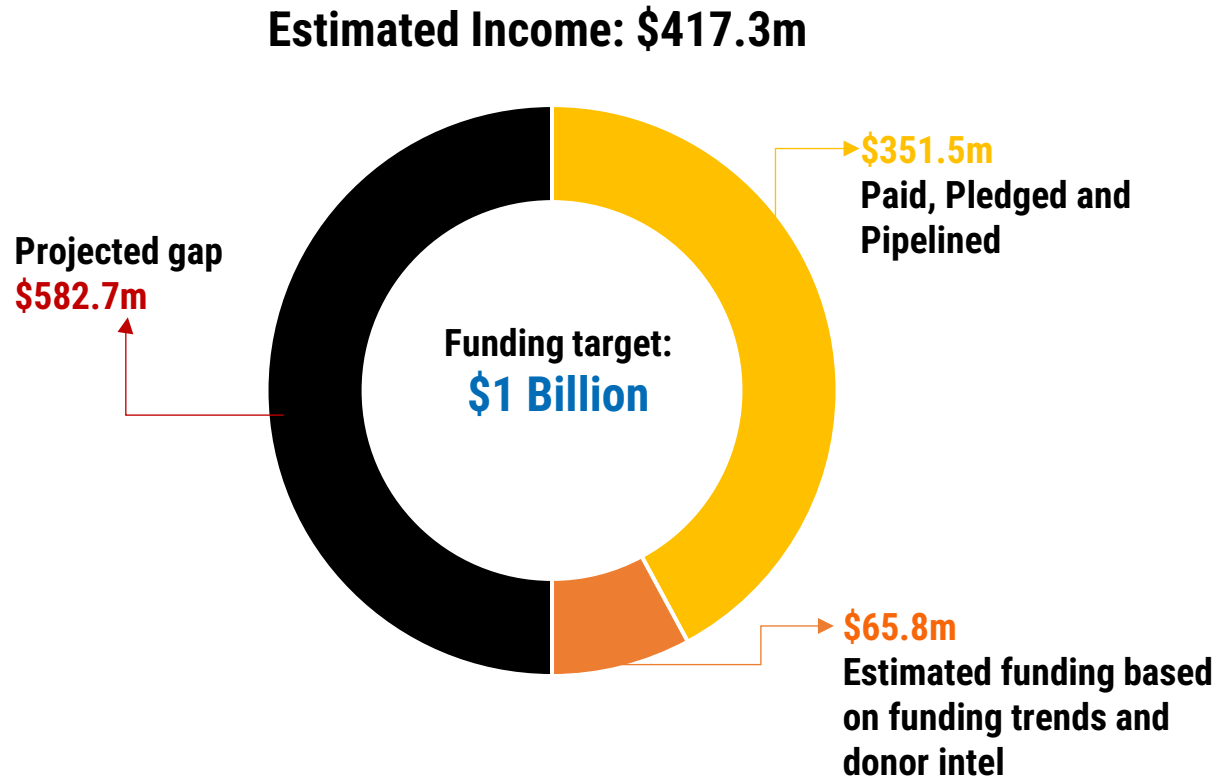
CERF's Donor Base

2025 Highlights so far:

Returning donors: 8 MS + 1 Observer
Private sector: \$2.29m including \$2m from Qatar Charity
Total Climate Action Account: \$19.5m

Resource Mobilization Priorities for 2025 & 2026

- **Maximize income** from high- and middle-income countries
- **Diversify the funding base**, including for the **CERF Climate Action Account** from other Member States, the private sector, and other sources
- **Increase multi-year funding agreements** to improve income predictability
- **Secure pledges for the remainder of 2025**
- **Secure pledges and early payments for 2026**
- Collaborate with CERF AG members on **Peer-to-Peer** outreach
- Collaborate with CERF AG members to enhance visibility of CERF and **communicate** its value
