\*\* Firstly, this includes \$25 million for the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) and UN Women to prevent violence against women and girls and assist victims and survivors to access multi-sectoral GBV responses in the following countries: Bangladesh, Cameroon, Colombia, Ethiopia, Iraq, Mali, Myanmar, occupied Palestinian territories (oPt), Somalia, Sudan and Venezuela. Secondly, this includes \$5 million for the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) and World Health Organization (WHO) to stop the spread of the Ebola virus disease in Sierra Leone, Liberia, Cote D'Ivoire, Mali, Senegal and Guinea-Bissau.
