CERF response overview 2019 as of 14 June 2019



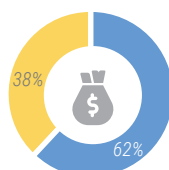

In March and April 2019, Southern Africa was hit by two subsequent cyclones that brought heavy flooding and left a trail of destruction across several countries. More than 3.4 million people are in need of urgent assistance. CERF allocated a total of US\$34.4 million to provide life-saving aid to affected communities. Within 48 hours after Cyclone Idai made landfall, the Emergency Relief Coordinator announced an allocation of some \$20 million to kick off relief efforts in Mozambique, Zimbabwe and Malawi. CERF began disbursing funds within five days of the grant application submission from Mozambique. A second allocation of \$13 million provided urgent food, shelter, water and sanitation for people affected by Cyclone Kenneth in Comoros and Mozambique.

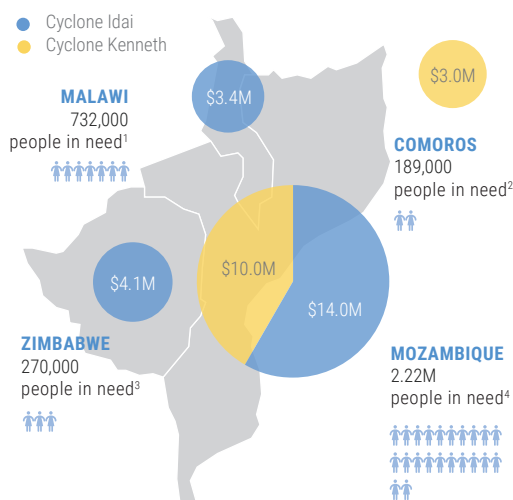

in US\$ millions

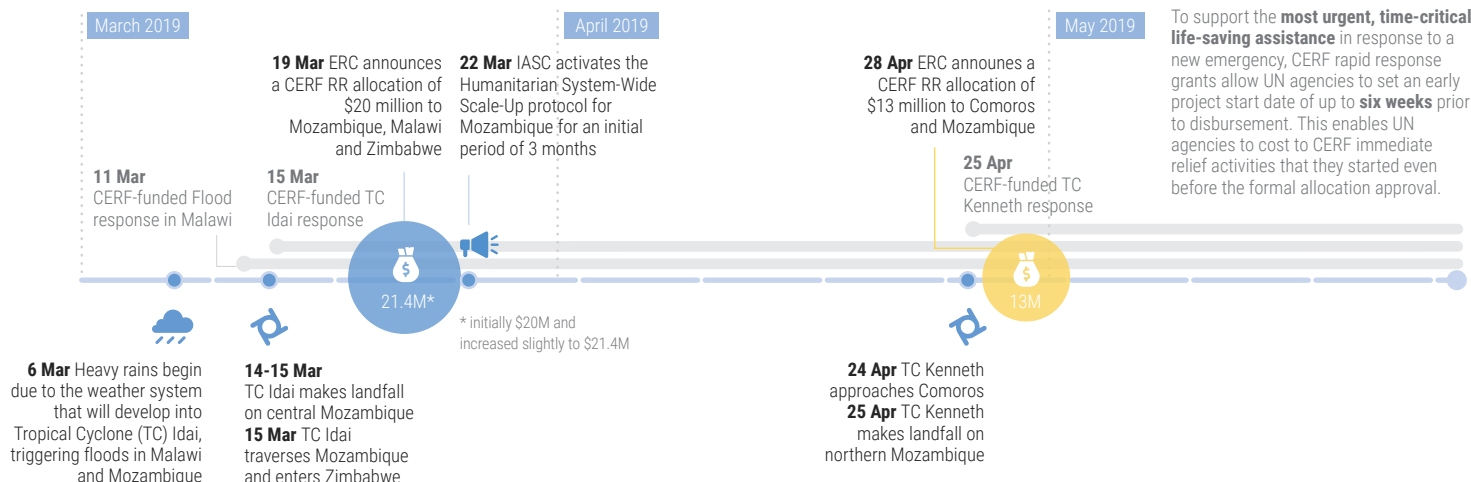


ALLOCATIONS TIMELINE

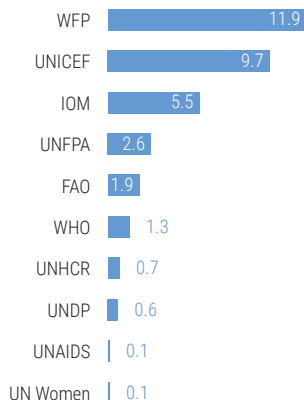

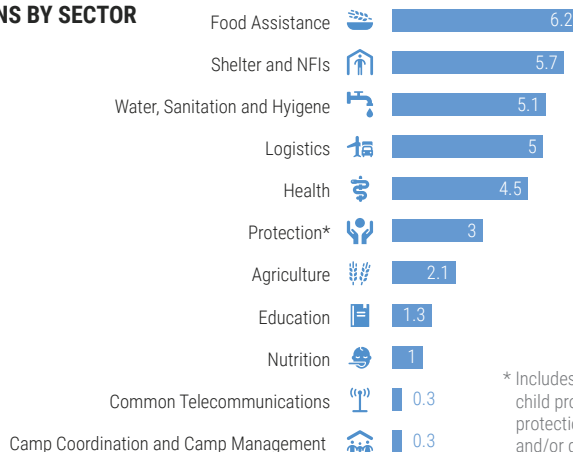
ALLOCATIONS BY AGENCY
