

HUMANITARIAN SITUATION

An estimated 2.8 million people are in need of humanitarian assistance in Haiti in 2018. The key humanitarian issues in Haiti are the unmet needs of people affected by Hurricane Matthew in October 2016, food insecurity, cholera epidemic and the Haitian-Dominican migration issue. The resulting diverse humanitarian needs are geographically spread across the entire country with varying levels of severity.

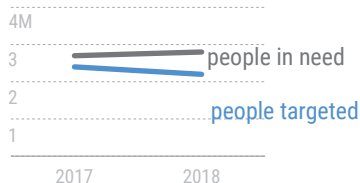

CERF RESPONSE

A \$9 million allocation will focus on the needs of 1.29 million people affected by recent hurricanes, and cholera and diphtheria outbreaks in the Centre, Nord-Est, Artibonite, Grand'Anse, Sud and Ouest departments. CERF will support life-saving interventions in the food security, nutrition, shelter and NFIs, health and WASH sectors.



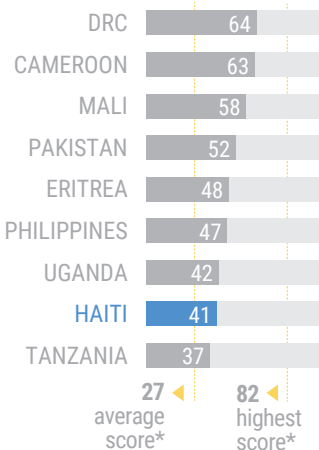

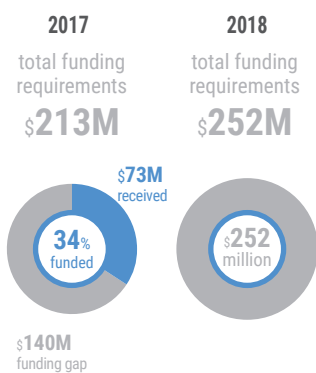

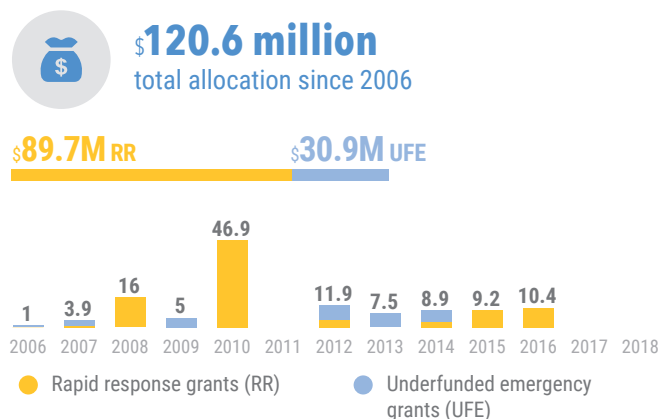
Risk & vulnerability⁵ CIRV (1-100)
