CERF RESPONSE IN 2017

The crisis caused by escalating violence in Myanmar's Rakhine State since 25 August 2017 has led to suffering on a catastrophic scale. The speed and scale of the influx have made it one of the world's fastest growing refugee crisis.¹ Approximately 1.2 million people – new refugees, prior refugees and host communities – in Bangladesh are in urgent need of assistance.² In September, CERF allocated US\$7 million to assist the most vulnerable people fleeing violence in Myanmar and their host communities in Bangladesh. In October, CERF released an additional \$12 million to scale up life-saving response efforts, bringing the total CERF support for the Rohingya refugee response in Bangladesh to \$19 million in 2017.

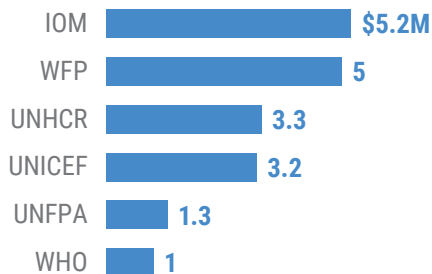

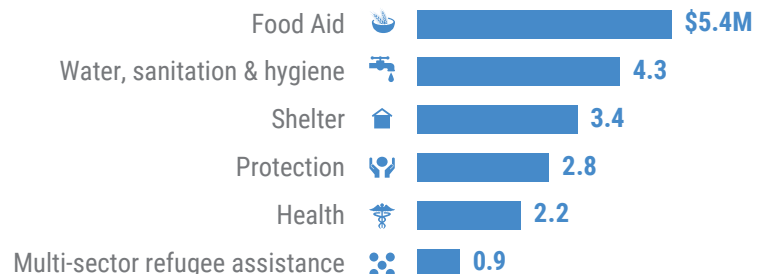

2017 ALLOCATIONS BY AGENCY in US\$ million



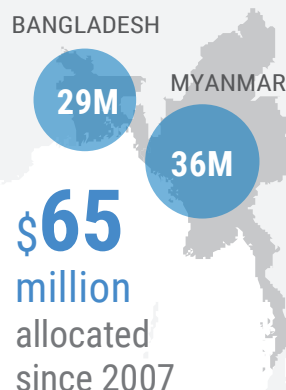
2017 ALLOCATIONS BY SECTOR in US\$ million



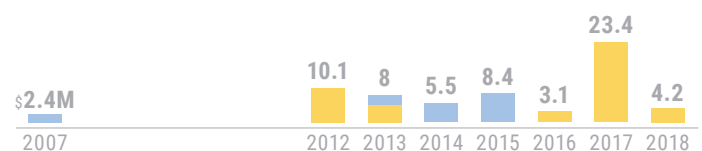
CERF ALLOCATIONS SINCE 2007

Since 2007, CERF has allocated over \$65 million for life-saving humanitarian assistance to people affected by conflict and natural disasters in the border of Myanmar and Bangladesh. In January 2018 following increased access, CERF allocated an additional \$4.2 million to provide food, protection and health care for people affected by the conflict in northern Rakhine State.

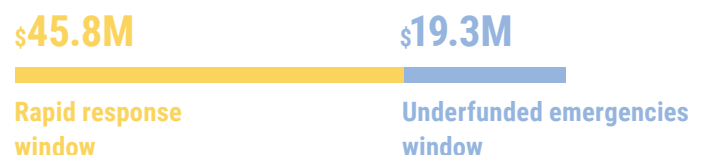
ALLOCATIONS BY COUNTRY in US\$ million
