Horn of Africa Drought: CERF Support in 2011



Drought in the Horn of Africa has left 13.3 million people in need of help. CERF funds have been addressing the crisis since rainfalls failed at the end of 2010. More than \$117 million has been allocated to Djibouti, Ethiopia, Kenya and Somalia in 2011.
